Conference on ASEM's Role in Enhancing Asia-Europe Cooperation: Nine months before the 6th ASEM Summit, a critical review of Asia-Europe cooperation

Experts and government officials from the 39 members of ASEM have evaluated 10 years of Asian-European dialogue and cooperation through reviewing a draft research report by the Japan Center for International Exchange (JCIE) and the Helsinki University Network for European Studies. The conference took place in Tokyo, Japan on 12-13 December 2005. The outcome of this conference will be presented to ASEM senior officials in March 2006 and serves as the basis for input to the 6th ASEM Summit (ASEM VI) to be held in Helsinki in September 2006. The Conference was followed by a public symposium in the afternoon of 13 December 2005. The open symposium presented to various sectors of the Japanese public key findings and recommendations of the Conference, as well as various views on trends and developments in the increasingly important relations between Asia and Europe.

The Conference serves as the first phase of consultations with civil society on ASEM issues, culminating in a meeting for NGOs, academics, researchers as well as business sector representatives at ASEM VI. This conference was co-organised by the Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF) and the Japan Center for International Exchange (JCIE), in collaboration with the European Union Institute of Japan (EUIJ), and with the support of the Finnish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The BJA is happy to announce the start for applications to the Young Executive Stay (YES) Programme V.

The YES programme is a commercial export project under the auspices of His Royal Highness Prince Philippe of Belgium. It aims to train young executives from Belgium and Luxembourg in successful Japanese business practices, at moderate costs, and in a short amount of time. For this purpose, in 2006 the Belgian-Luxembourg Chamber of Commerce in Japan, the Belgium-Japan Association & Chamber of Commerce and the Luxembourg Chamber of Commerce will organise a two-week training programme in Japan, beginning with two briefing sessions in Belgium. The training in Japan will consist of 2 days of group studies (lectures and company visits), the remaining days used for introducing each participant to potential customers in his/her business area. The YES programme enjoys the support of the Embassies of Belgium and Luxembourg in Japan and of the representatives of the three Belgian Regions.

Business opportunities with Japanese vehicle manufacturers

The 8th JAMA-CLEPA Business Conference, which took place in Turin from 7-10 November, proved to be as successful as its previous editions.

The 2005 event assembled 88 companies from 12 different countries. They were mainly tier 1, 2 and 3 suppliers interested in broadening and improving their business opportunities with Japanese vehicle manufacturers, and firms providing services for the automotive sector.

In a total of 1170-square-metres display area and through some 250 prescheduled face-to-face meetings (and many more informal ones), the 500 participants were given a real chance to foster their business partnerships with 11 different OEMs.

JAMA and CLEPA have been organising joint events since March 1995, and since then some 574 European suppliers have participated at the Business Conferences, and 1794 face-to-face meetings have been organised.

This year also the EU-Japan Centre for Industrial Cooperation was present for the first time.

German-Japanese research cooperation opens the door to new markets

A new collaborative venture was sealed in Munich in July 2005 by researchers from the Fraunhofer-Gesellschaft and Japanese colleagues from Tohoku University in Japan. Their joint objective is to develop MEMS, micro-electromechanical systems for small and medium-sized enterprises in Japan.

"Micro-electromechanical systems, or MEMS, is an engineering discipline that involves the design of integrated components combining sensors, actuators and electronic circuits," according to Professor Thomas Geßner of the Fraunhofer Institute for Reliability and Microintegration IZM in Chemnitz.

To cater for the needs of smaller firms, Professor Geßner in Chemnitz and Professor Masayoshi Esashi at Tohoku University are putting their know-how at the disposal of the enterprises based in the technology park in Sendai, Japan.

Professor Geßner has considerable experience in industrial applications of micro-electromechanical systems, and Professor Esashi is one of the world's leading experts in MEMS research.

Initiated by the Fraunhofer Representative Office in Japan, a Memorandum of Understanding between the two research groups and the city of Sendai was signed at the Fraunhofer headquarters in Munich on 15 July.

"We are very much looking forward to working with our Japanese colleagues," affirmed Dr. Alfred Gossner, Senior Vice-President Finance and Controlling of the Fraunhofer-Gesellschaft, during the official event. "This cooperation agreement is a welcome addition to our activities in Asia, and more especially Japan. As a globally thinking research organisation, we place great value on setting up international ventures of this nature."

Keidanren Mission to Greece

3-5 September 2005

High-ranking members of the Nippon Keidanren visited Greece on 3-5 September 2005, headed by Mr. Hiromasa YONEKURA, Chairman of SUMITOMO Chemical Co., Ltd., Vice-Chairman of Nippon Keidanren and Chairman of its Committee on Europe.

Nippon Keidanren is the key representative organisation for Japanese business and industry with 1,645 members. It represents the interests of 1,326 leading companies, 131 industrial sector associations and 47 regional employers' associations. Keidanren is committed to contributing to the further development of the national and global economy.

The tourism sector (air freighters), industrial sector (electronic and cars), financial sector and chemical sector were represented in the Mission.

The schedule of the Keidanren Mission in Athens included meetings with governmental representatives such as the Minister of Economy and Finance, Mr. Alogoskoufis, the Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs on International Economic Relations, Mr. Stylianides, and members of the Federation of Greek Industries (SEV) and the Greek Japanese Chamber of Commerce. The discussions focused on the future of the Greek economy, the investment opportunities in Greece, the current status after the Enlargement of the EU, the strategic role of Greece in the enlarged European Union and finally on the development of Greek-Japanese economic relations.

Japanese companies are interested in expanding even further in the enlarged European Union of 25 members that is today a unified market of 450 million people, and Greece has a key role in the Balkan region as the only member country of the EU. Under these circumstances, the Japanese Government believes that such a meeting is a very good and effective opportunity to exchange views on a high level among high-ranking governmental and business executives of the two countries.
